I love doing outreach. It gives me the opportunity to meet people that I have never met before. I am able to help our homeless community by doing housing assessments to assist with obtaining housing and transporting them to our community partners that can connect them with resources to obtain their birth certificates, identification, and other important documents that they might need to be self-sufficient; but, I also get to learn their story of how they became homeless.

Once, I had a family of five that became homeless and after speaking with them and doing an assessment, I HAD to find them somewhere to live. So, I called all the resources that we have and finally found somewhere for them to call their home. The mother was placed in a fit program to where she will learn a trade and start working. The greatest feeling I get is when you find a place for a family and know that you can be proud of what you have done."

Simply put, my passion is children. I want the best for every child that I encounter and the families that support them. This passion was not realized until my own son was diagnosed with attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD). Seeing his struggles over those first years prompted me to become the best advocate for him. During that process, I realized there were many more kids out there like him with similar struggles and families like ours not knowing where to turn and how to maintain a balanced family life. Every step I took in advocating for my own child led me down the path of advocating for all children and their families that need help. I now specialize mostly in children who are on the autism spectrum disorder as those with ADHD, anxiety, trauma, and developmental delays.

I have a master's degree in developmental psychology with an emphasis on children and adolescents. In addition, I have the following certifications:

- Nevada State Licensed K-8 teacher with autism endorsement
- Certified Family Trauma Professional (CFTP)
- Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT) for depression, anxiety, phobias, and panic attacks
- Dialectical Behavioral Therapy (DBT)

I believe fully in the whole child approach as the most effective way of understanding our children. With compassion and empathy at my core, I carefully listen and observe to understand the child and their caregiver's concerns, ask questions to help develop understanding of the child's world around them, and carefully develop a plan of how to best advocate for the child. Additionally, a child's advocate needs to also advocate and be there for their family. If the family unit is cohesive and functioning, the child will be too. Therefore, my goal is the wellbeing of the entire family.

My short time here at WestCare has proven to be a great decision. The company's philosophy perfectly aligns with my beliefs that everyone deserves a fresh start and that it takes a village to raise children. Every single employee and client that I have encountered has been warm and caring, which has made me feel at home since my first day.
